

# SUPPORTING RESOURCES & MATERIALS SURVEY

Dear Extension Faculty and Program Assistants:

The purpose of the following survey is to determine what types of wildlife-related materials, supporting documents, props, etc. are currently available and where and who has them in the state. The idea behind the survey is to gather these materials and make them available to all extension personnel in a centralized location. Almost all topics and extension programs are in some way related directly or indirectly to wildlife issues (e.g., energy conservation and environmental friendly gardening techniques) so do not assume that your specialty, topic, or program is too obscure. Master gardener, master wildlife conservation, Florida's yard & neighborhood, fishing for success, Florida's wildlife habitat, and forest stewardship programs probably all have materials and components related to wildlife issues either directly or indirectly. For example, a power point presentation about how to reduce use of fertilizers and pesticides has indirect and direct impacts on invertebrate and vertebrate distributions.

Ultimately, we would like assist your programming efforts by producing a place on our Wildlife Extension Web site ( <http://www.wec.ufl.edu/extension/> ) where faculty and program assistants can find information, materials, and downloadable programs that could be adapted for a variety of local educational programs.
